
Mapping Inundation extent for Gampaha District in Western Province (Sri Lanka) using Satellite Data (23,25 and 26 May 2018)



Heavy rainfall occurred on 20th and 21st May 2018 which has resulted in flooding forcing evacuation of people in low-lying areas where four Major rivers have reached flood levels, while 6 districts are on "red alert" for possible landslides. About 174,310 people have been affected by the floods. The death toll in Sri Lanka's monsoon rains has climbed to 24 as 28th May 2018 (DMC

The initial satellite observations from ALOS-2 PALSAR-2 (23 May 2018) showed vast areas of standing flood waters along the North Western, Western and Southern Provinces. Initial estimates from satellite images indicate that Puttalam (68.4 sq.km), Kurunagala (135.5.sq.km), Gampaha (37.7 sq.km) Galle (9.2 sq.km), Kaluthara (8.1 sq.km), Rathnapura (4.6 km.sq), Colombo (2.1 sq.km). Most of the district flood is reducing but rivers are still under minor flood level.

The satellite image from ALOS-2 PALSAR-2 taken on 23 May2018 showing considerable inundation for Gampaha and reference to dark with deep water and dark grey color in the agriculture fields with water. Most of the areas are still water logged due to the second rainfall event on 25th May 2018 in Gampaha district.



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
