



n the capital of Turkmenistan, Ashgabat, heavy rains have been ongoing for the third day. According to "Meteojournal," 21 mm of precipitation fell on May 14 and 15, and a total of 80 mm has fallen since the beginning of the month. This is 3.5 times the monthly norm.

Currently, May 1978 is considered the rainiest month, with 85 mm of precipitation. It is likely that this year's record will be broken, the publication writes.


